Serving 35 counties and nearly 400 local pantries, Feeding America Eastern Wisconsin used their donation to further their efforts of providing access to nutritious food and fighting hunger within our communities.

New Community Shelter

As a refuge for the homeless in Brown County, the New Community Shelter emphasizes respect, empowerment and accountability in the services they deliver to the community. Their donation was used to support their community meal program, available to any adult or child, 365 days a year.

Greater Green Bay YMCA

With a mission to strengthen the community in body and mind, the Greater Green Bay YMCA is a place where everyone belongs. Their donation helped support afterschool programs by providing enrichment and learning opportunities to lift up our youngest generations.

Runners tied their laces and hit the pavement in May of 2023 for the Cellcom Green Bay Marathon. The annual event welcomed thousands of runners to Green Bay celebrating wellness and driving economic impact for local businesses. The non-profit event makes a year-round impact through a donation of event proceeds to local charity partners. During the 24th year, the Cellcom Green Bay Marathon was proud to award a total of \$50,000 to three charity partners, Feeding America Eastern Wisconsin, Greater Green Bay YMCA, and **New Community Shelter.**

A focus on sustainability

At Nsight, we are committed to helping sustain life within our communities. In 2023, our company's sustainability focus grew as we partnered with an outside vendor to gain a better understanding of our carbon footprint. By tracking our greenhouse gas emissions, our goal is to set emissions reduction targets for future years, managing our environmental risks and opportunities in the communities we work to protect.

A few steps Nsight has taken to implement positive environmental change include:

- Introducing eco-friendly, compostable retail bags at all Cellcom retail stores.
- Expanding native grass and pollinator zones at our corporate campus in Howard, Wis.
- Reducing vehicle idling among engineering teams to reduce fuel consumption and emissions.
- Growing our 5G network, known to be greener than predecessors with improved energy efficiency.

For 20 years, Cellcom has offered a cell phone recycling program, allowing customers to bring in their old or unwanted phones to be reused and recycled. Money generated from these recycling efforts helps fund the Green Gifts program, which supports environmentally focused non-profit initiatives.

In 2023, Cellcom's Green Gifts supported 26 non-profits and their efforts of addressing sustainability, supporting environmental outreach and educational efforts, conserving local natural resources, and inspiring the next generation of environmental advocates.

What are greenhouse gases?

Seven students received the \$1,200 Nsight Telservices scholarship and 16 students were awarded the \$750 Cellcom scholarship. Recipients demonstrated academic success and leadership within their schools and community, paving the way for others as they worked to reach their full potential.

Established in 1989, the Ray J. Riordan, Sr. Scholarship recognizes Pulaski High School seniors who serve as editors for the Pulaski News. As the oldest student-run community newspaper in the U.S., the Pulaski News enlists student reporters and editors to share important community updates while serving as a workforce development tool. In addition to their work as editors, scholarship recipients are selected on a basis of academic achievement, leadership and participation in school and community activities and in 2023, two students were awarded a \$750 scholarship.
